



**IT IS NOW POSSIBLE FOR FAMILY OF ALASKA INMATES AT HUDSON, COLORADO TO VISIT THROUGH A VIDEO LINK FROM ANCHORAGE. HERE ARE THE BASIC PARAMETERS:**

**Q. Is it possible to visit inmates at the Department of Corrections contract facility in Hudson, Colorado by video connection?**

**A. YES. A procedure for Video Visitation has been established.**

**Q. Where does this take place?**

**A. Video Visitation takes place in Anchorage, at the Cordova Center, 130 Cordova Street. Call 274-1022 if you need directions.**

**Q. Is there a cost?**

**A. YES. There is a \$10 fee for a 45-minute session. Cash or money orders are accepted.**

**Q. What is the procedure for scheduling a video visit?**

**A. First, visitors must be on the inmate's approved visitor list. This must be done by the inmate at Hudson. To approve a video visit, please follow these steps:**

- 1. Call the Video Visitation Coordinator seven days in advance to schedule a video visit. The number is: 303-536-2600. Call weekdays between 8 am and 3 pm Alaska time. Press "0" when prompted.**
- 2. You will receive a firm date and time, based on a first come, first served basis.**

**Q. Can inmates 'double up' for a video visit?**

**A. NO. Only one inmate per visit. Up to four family members, including children, may participate in the visit.**

**Q. Suppose there is a delay or break due to technical reasons ...**

**A. An effort will be made to extend the time to compensate for the delay.**

**Q. Can inmates in segregation or in the medical unit participate in video visitation?**

**A. It is possible for an inmate who is not in general population to take part in video visitation. Approval will be granted on a case-by-case basis.**

**Q. Can video visitation be used for meetings of a legal nature?**

**A. NO. This is because confidentiality cannot be assured.**

**Q. What happens when it is time to hold the video visitation?**

**A. Visitors should arrive at the Cordova Center no less than 30 minutes, but no more than 45 minutes prior to the visit. This will allow enough time for processing. Visitors, 16 years and older, must have photo ID such as a driver's license, state-issued ID card, passport, or other government-issued photo identification. It is required to present photo ID**

**Q. Can visitors be suspended or banned from participation?**

**A. YES. Visitors may have their video visitation privilege suspended or ended for inappropriate dress or other misconduct. If you have questions about dress or what might be considered misconduct, please ask staff before the session begins. Visitors at the Colorado facility who lose visitation privileges cannot participate in video visitation.**
